WHAT IS THE RESEARCH ABOUT?

Researchers at Newcastle University and Northumbria University would like to talk to people and their family members who have had care at home where there has been a change to the number of paid care workers who attend at any one time (or any review of the number of workers needed whether this led to a change or not).



The purpose of this research is to use the experiences of those involved in these changes, alongside other information, to make recommendations on how they should be performed in the future. We are interested in **negative experiences** as well as **positive** ones.

WHO CAN TAKE PART?

Any person or relative who has experience of a change in the number of paid care workers they receive at home, or have had a review of the number of workers needed whether this led to a change or not. We want to talk to family members just as much as those receiving care.

WHAT WOULD IT INVOLVE?

A researcher would get in touch with you, give you more information, and give you the opportunity to ask questions. If you then gave consent, the researcher would carry out an interview with you over the telephone or by video link (whatever you prefer) to chat about your experience. This would take up to around 45 minutes and you could have a friend or family member with you if you would like to.
