#### **Crossroads Care Surrey**

Crossroads offer an Emergency Care Planning Service with access to 24- hour support if required through either your own nominated person or they can arrange for free professional care support workers to step in once you have registered with them. You can also receive a carers card and a helpline number to call if an emergency arises.

They also offer Carer Replacement Breaks (up to 35 hours) to help you take some time out from the caring role.
