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Flamboyant swimmer completes 18 month-long One Hundred Hats Swim Challenge for young carers in Surrey

Jule Harries undertook to complete 100 open water swims wearing a different hat each time to raise money for Surrey Young Carers (part of Action for Carers) and Alzheimer's Research UK and, 18 months later, is due to complete her challenge on Sunday June 25th, 2023.

Jule, from Beare Green, Surrey, took up open water swimming in May 2021 and after a few months decided to take her new-found love of swimming to the next level with an eye-catching challenge!

If taking on 100 open water swims wasn't enough, she wanted to do it in a range of weird and wonderful hats.

She started her challenge way back on Remembrance Sunday 2021, donning a vintage tin helmet as her first hat. The halfway point was marked with a meter-high floral creation, complete with cherry blossom and daffodils, to celebrate May Day and to herald the start of summer last year.

Other hats have included a Carmen Miranda-style mountain-of-fruit headpiece, massive lunchbox, Ukrainian flower headdress and most recently an enormous tin of SPAM and a giant movable Rubik's cube. Jule usually ties in the choice of hat with special events or celebrations close to the day of her swim, and has created the most theatrical and flamboyant hats herself. As the challenge has progressed the hats have become more ostentatious and difficult to swim in, as Steph McGovern (CH4 Steph's Packed Lunch) commented "They're not just any hats, they're massive!"





Supporting important causes

Jule's inspiring challenge is raising vital funds for two charities very close to her heart.

She said: "I was keen to help local charity, Surrey Young Carers (part of Action for Carers), as I work in a school where a number of pupils are registered as young carers. The charity provides support and advice to these youngsters and gives them opportunities to meet others in similar situations, share their experiences, and take time out from their caring role"

"I'm also supporting Alzheimer's Research UK as I have seen firsthand the devastating impact of dementia and have also worked as a research scientist, so I know how important their work is in finding a cure for this horrible disease."

All weathers

Swimming throughout the seasons in all weathers, and in the dark, has been challenging but Jule has enjoyed the support and encouragement of her fellow swimmers and the safety team at the lake at Buckland Park.

She said: "This has been a very happy challenge, which brought a smile to people's faces, and I always felt very uplifted after completing each swim... even if I didn't feel like getting into the freezing water beforehand! That's not the only challenge though: deciding on a theme, designing and making it, and then trying to safely swim with it when it might be large, uncomfortable, unstable or all three, is part of the test... and part of the fun."
