- Register the adult patient as a carer using Read Code 918g.
- Register young carers (5 to 18 years) using Read Code 918h.

- Ensure the carer has been given information and understands the benefits of registering as a carer.
- The Carer Prescription is also available to the practice to refer carers to other services.
 Note: The GP will have to get consent from the carer to complete and submit the carers prescription.
